

# Union County Demo Day Details

## **Classes Offered:**

1. Juniors, ages 8-11, No Computer Technology permitted
2. Intermediates, ages 12-13, No Computer Technology Used
3. Intermediates, ages 12-13, With Technology
4. Seniors, ages 14-18, No Computer Technology Used
5. Seniors, ages 14-18, With Computer Technology
6. Seniors, ages 14-18, Multi-Media Presentation
7. Teams, ages 8-13, No Computer Technology permitted

## **Demo Day Rules**

1. All work is to be original, created by the 4-H member and must be related to the member's current project, club office, or 4-H experiences.
2. No large animals may be used in a demonstration. Animals under 20 lbs may be used, provided they do not place the public or participants at risk. No firearms, bows, arrows or weapons are permitted. No aerosol products are permitted.
3. 4-H'ers opting to use computer generated technology (classes 3, 5, & 6) must provide their own electronic equipment. A screen will be provided.
4. Members should set up their presentation by themselves, including electronic equipment. A teen leader will be available to help move equipment.
5. Equipment available on request will include: 8 foot table, easel, electric power.
6. No microphones will be used. Demonstrators will need to speak loud enough to be heard by the judges and the audience.
7. Demonstration should last between 3 and 10 minutes. (Exception Class 6)

## **Additional information for Classes *without* computer technology: Classes 1, 2, 4, & 7**

1. The 4-H'er uses appropriate props and other visual aids such as posters, pictures, and charts to teach others about a subject or how to do something.
2. No Power Point or computer generated messages are permitted.
3. Class 4 County Winners will not be eligible to go to Ohio State Fair as OSF does not offer this class (Senior age, no technology used).

## **Additional information for Classes *with* computer technology: Classes 3, 5**

1. The 4-H'er uses appropriate props and computer generated visual aids to teach others about a subject or how to do something. Examples: A demonstration may be delivered and Power Point type slides may be added, along with other props to help present the message. Example #2: An illustrated talk may be delivered with the 4-H'er using Power Point type technology to present their entire visual message, accompanied by live narration by the 4-H'er. Note that pre-recorded narration is not permitted in classes 3 & 5.

## **Additional information for Class 6: Multimedia Presentation**

1. The Multi-media presentation should share a message related to 4-H project work or experiences.
2. This is a fully automated, stand alone presentation using video, pictures, slides, Power Point or other home/office computer generated programs along with sound and narration to convey a message.
3. Evaluation will be based on the creative and professional use of technology, as well as the ability to communicate a message, with a clear opening, body, and conclusion. See the score sheet for details.
4. This is an individual, no team, senior age division class only.
5. Multi-media presentation must be between 6- 7 minutes in length. The 4-H'er will answer questions following the presentation, and Q&A time is not included in the length of presentation.

## **Additional Information for Class 7 (Teams):**

1. A team will consist of 2 members, ages 8-13, working together as a demonstration. No one over 14 years of age may participate in a team.
2. No computer technology may be used in a team demonstration.
