

CAT 1 PURR- FECT PALS - 216 Project Guide Sheet

Project Description

In this beginning project, you learn about being a good cat owner. Learn how to choose the best cat for you & your family, how to properly groom your cat, the cost of raising a cat, and much more. You may take this project for a maximum of 3 years.

To complete the Project

Use your project book as a guide to do the following:

1. Complete the "Cat-a-logue Your Knowledge" evaluation before & after you complete the project.
2. Complete the "Goals and Outcomes" section of your book found on page 3.
3. Complete a minimum of 7 of the main activities or "Feline Adventures" activities per year.
4. Complete the Purr-fect Pals Achievement Program within 3 years.
5. Practice & develop life skills under Project Guidelines on page 2.

If you choose not to participate in judging at the fair, make arrangements to discuss and review completion of your project with your advisor.

Judging of this Project

This project will be judged as part of Special Interest Judging;

at the Richwood Fair Wednesday, August 27, 10:30 a.m.

Or

at the Union County Fair on Monday, July 21, 9:00-3:30 p.m.

Your advisor will tell you a more specific judging time later in the summer. At the specific judging time assigned to you, **bring your completed project book, your project display, complete & current inoculation records, and feed tag/label or feed sample with list of ingredients.** Bring your cat to judging in an animal carrier or on a leash. Remember there will be other animals at the judging. You will participate in an interview judging and then leave your exhibit (a display of your project) on display the entire week of the fair.

Project Display

Prepare a display that shows the judge and fair visitors what you learned and accomplished in your project. Your display could be a scrapbook, poster, item you created, or any method of showing what you have done. **If you choose to make a poster, the maximum size is 22"x28". Use regular poster paper, not foam board or a tri-fold board.** You may need to walk a distance from your parked vehicle to judging, plan accordingly. You may choose to bring additional items to show the judge your project work, that you do not leave on display. This is acceptable. You must however, leave something on display the entire week. **Your project book cannot serve as your project display.** Plan your display item carefully: fragile, valuable, or items that will be damaged by dust are not a good idea.

At the Union County Fair Special Interest Projects will be displayed in the Armory. At the Richwood Fair these projects will be displayed in the Booth Building.

Project Pick-Up

You must pick up your project display at the end of the fair, or arrange for someone to get it for you. At Union County Fair, Special Interest Projects will be released on Sunday, July 27, at 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Projects not picked up by 4 p.m. will be disposed of or donated to charities. At the Richwood Fair, all Special Interest Projects will be released at 5 p.m. on Monday, September 1, and should be removed by 9 p.m.

Award Presentation

Union County Fair Special Interest Project Awards will be presented at the Jr. Fair Awards Program on Saturday morning, July 26, 9:15 a.m. in front of the Grandstand. Richwood Fair Special Interest Project Awards will be presented at the Jr. Fair Awards Program during the fair. Check the fair paper for the day, time, and location of this program.

Ohio State Fair Opportunity

This project **Does** have the opportunity to participate at The Ohio State Fair in 2008. **Every 4-Her who wishes to compete with this project must submit an Ohio State Fair Companion Animal Day Entry Form to the Ohio State Fair Livestock Entry Department. Entries must be postmarked no later than July 11, 2008. Entry fee is \$2 per project.**
