## Jr. Fair Exhibitor Passes & Advisor Passes

Junior Fair Exhibitor passes must be purchased as a group by a club/chapter advisor from the Senior Fair Office at the fairgrounds. Jr. Fair exhibitor and Advisor passes are \$5 each. Passes will not be sold to individual members; advisors, please don't tell your member to get their own passes.



*Exhibitors:* Don't come to the Sr.Fair Board Office for your pass; see your advisor.

## Special Interest Project Awards Program

Special Interest Project Awards will be presented on **Tuesday, July 27** at 4 p.m. (Following the 4-H Style Review) at the Pavilion on the fairgrounds. Demo Day Awards will also be presented at this time. State Fair packets for those selected to take a Special Interest Project to The Ohio StateFair will be given at this Awards Program. Please try to be present to receive this information. For many projects there is a very short turnaround time between our fair and The Ohio State Fair Event for which you may be selected.

**Reminder:** The Armory will **BE CLOSED** all day on Sunday, July 25, while the Jr. Fair Board members put projects on display and place award stickers on Special Interest Projects.

## Junior Fair Premium Vouchers

Junior Fair Exhibitors will receive their premium(s) via cash, at the conclusion of their interview or Skillathon. A Jr Fair premium is given for participation in the Department Judging event (interview or Skillathon) and having the project on display for the designated time period. Exhibitors will sign for their premium money as they receive it.

## Information for Livestock Exhibitors

In each livestock barn, there is a bulletin board where information is posted. Every exhibitor should stop by this spot at least once a day to check for information or updates pertaining to their barn. For example: Showmanship Class lists will be posted here.

**Barn Pass Information** (For Livestock Exhibitor families)

Any livestock family wishing to get a barn pass can obtain 1 Barn pass per family, in person, at the Senior Fair Office on the Fairgrounds. Family names will be checked off a list of livestock exhibitors. The Senior Fair Board will be enforcing the one (1) pass per family rule. This Barn pass sticker allows a vehicle to drive toward the barns for unloading feed/equipment **between the hours of 10pm and 9am**. Each livestock family will need to sign for their own barn pass at the Sr. Fair Office; these cannot be picked up by advisors. For questions about this Barn pass privilege, ask the Senior Fair Board.

**Livestock Arrival Times - All livestock** must enter the State Route 4 fair entrance.

**Move-In Reminders:**

- All poultry exhibitors will be asked to pay \$2 for shavings at the time of check-in.
- Each Rabbit Exhibitor will pay \$5 for shavings upon check-in on Sunday.
- Beef and Dairy Exhibitors may begin bringing equipment into the barn at 9am on Saturday, July 24. Barn chart will be posted at 9am, so do not move in prior.
- Mulch will be provided for bedding for all market beef. It will be placed in your assigned stall space. Mulch fee will be assessed per head @ market price.



**Drug Use Notification Forms: New Process this year**

New this year: Drug Use Notification Forms must be completed online prior to arrival at the Fair. DUNF's must be completed July 19-23<sup>rd</sup>. The deadline is Noon on July 23<sup>rd</sup>. All market exhibitors will receive a link via email at the email address used to create the fair entries on July 19<sup>th</sup> to complete the DUNF. The DUNF form is exactly the same as past years but will be filled out and signed digitally this year. It will only take a few moments to complete and sign online.

If an exhibitor's DUNF form is not completed online, they will not be permitted to weigh in/show.

Each market, lactating dairy cattle, and goat exhibitor will need to complete a DUNF for each animal or pen they bring to the fair. Non-market animals, like single rabbits, donot need to complete a DUNF. Any medicated feeds and drugs which have been given to the animal within 30 days of the fair must be listed on the DUNF. DUNF is a requirement of the Ohio Dept. of Agriculture.

## **Livestock Skillathons**

Each exhibitor can download a Skillathon Study Guide for their specie. The Skillathon Study Guide describes each station in your Skillathon to help you prepare. Please review the Livestock Skillathon schedule on the [Fair Schedule](#).

Each livestock exhibitor should bring their Livestock Record Book and a pencil to the Skillathon. Be sure you have the record book and have it completed before the fair. (Hint: The Record Book is one of the easiest ways to earn Skillathon points because you can do it all in advance!). ## **Poultry NPIP Reminders**

All poultry exhibitors must have current NPIP papers in order to cage their birds at the fair. This is state law. This includes all fancy poultry, pullets, and all market birds (broilers, turkeys and market ducks). Only pigeons, exhibition ducks and exhibition geese are exempt.

IF you ordered market broilers or turkeys through Dick Cryder, he has the paperwork. If you ordered market ducks through June Seymour, she has the paperwork. Details about pullorum testing being offered on Saturday, July 10 from 9 – 10 at the Fairgrounds was emailed to all poultry exhibitors earlier this week. The email was sent to the email address used in creating the entries for the fair.

## Market Livestock Pictures

For exhibitors of Market Livestock Projects, a picture will be taken of you and your animal by the Livestock Committee and given to the buyer of your animal during the Livestock Sale. These are the pictures you see hanging in area businesses, often for years. **Therefore, it is important that you be dressed appropriately at picture time.** You do not have to be in “show clothes” for pictures, but you must be neat, clean, and appropriately dressed. (No torn clothing, no hats, no undergarments showing, etc.)



Use the Show Dress Code as a guide. This means no T-shirts, no hats, etc. If it's not possible to be dressed appropriately for pictures, it may not be possible for you to participate in the sale.

If you are not going to be present at weigh-in (someone else is weighing your animal for you), it is **your responsibility** to submit a 4x6, vertical, picture of yourself with your animal to the JuniorFair Office by Noon on Wednesday, July 28, in order for you to participate in the Livestock Sale.

## Jr. Fair Livestock Sale – July 31 Reminders and Updates

### Sale Designation Forms

To consign your market livestock project to be sold in the Livestock Sale you must complete a yellow Sale Designation Form (SDF). It is due **immediately** following your show. Animals ARE NOT automatically consigned to the sale. If you do not turn in a SDF, you will not sell.

**Parents: Please make absolutely sure this task is completed before your child leaves the barn after the show.**

**Sale Order:** The Junior Fair Livestock Sale will begin on Saturday at 11 am and species will sell in the following order: Dairy Products, Broilers, Dairy Feeders, Ducks, Hogs, Turkeys, Market Goats, Market Lambs, Pen of 3 Rabbits, Market Beef.

### Updates for this year

To participate in the Livestock sale: The exhibitor must put an animal on the resale truck (last year was an exception) The animal designated for the sale cannot be released before the sale because of illness or other reasons.

The Livestock sale will take place in the Rabbit/Poultry Barn. The only animals going through the sale ring will be champions.

Because the sale will be in the Rabbit/Poultry Barn, rabbits and birds will be released early so the barn can be cleaned and then set up for the sale.

The option to have an animal processed is very limited - Jenkins Meats will not be able to accept appointments on the day of the sale.

## **Ribbon Cutting for New Beef Barn**

The Senior Fair Board will host a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the new Beef Barn on Monday July 26 at 9 am. All are invited. Doughnuts and water will be available following a short dedication.

- ✓ **Show Ring Bleacher Cleaning**  
Help is needed to clean up trash from under the bleachers after each livestock show. The job is too big to be accomplished alone. Volunteers will gather the trash from under the bleachers and place it near the driveway trash barrels where it can be collected. The sign-up list will be posted on the bulletin board in the Junior Fair Board Office at the fairgrounds.

## **Review the Rules!**

For those of you who are new to fair participation, be aware that fair participation is an option, and that youth and families who choose to participate must educate themselves about the rules and procedures which govern each exhibition. When you choose to become a fair exhibitor, you have moved beyond the realm of 4-H, and into the arena governed by our Agricultural Societies (Fair Boards).

It is your responsibility to read and know the rules pertaining to exhibiting. It is not somebody's job "to tell you". Make sure to read the rules for the Department you are entered in from the [2021 Junior Fair Supplement](#).

## **Richwood Independent Fair News**

Richwood Junior Fair entries are due Monday, August 2. We will take entries at the Extension Office until 4 pm on August 2.

Tattooing (mandatory) for Pen of 3 Meat Rabbits for the Richwood Fair will be held Saturday, August 7, at 9 am at the Richwood Fairgrounds. Each exhibitor may tattoo a maximum total of 6 rabbits.

Richwood Jr. Fair Entry Cards are available now. Fair Queen and King Applications are also due August 2.
