

# Union County Fair Livestock Exhibitors Important Announcements and Requirements July 19, 2021

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## Drug Use Notification Forms (DUNF)

This year all DUNF's will need to be completed online, **prior to your arrival at the Fair**. Use the link below to complete your DUNF between July 19-23. **The deadline is Noon on July 23<sup>rd</sup>**.

Here are some details and Frequently Asked Questions:

Do I have to do DUNF online? / Can I use a paper form?

Ohio Dept. of Agriculture is no longer accepting paper forms, you **MUST** complete your DUNF online.

What information do I need?

The information required by the online form is **EXACTLY** the same as the old paper form. You will need your animal ID/Tag #, and your own info (address, etc.).

IF you treated your animal you will need to put that information on the form. The exhibitor and the parent will sign the form electronically. If you have your information ready it will take you less than 5 minutes to complete the form.

Can I put all my animals on the same form?

No. As in the past, you will complete a separate DUNF for **each** market goat, lamb, dairy feeder, steer, hog, or pen of rabbits or poultry. Lactating (in milk) dairy cattle also need to file a DUNF. Breeding stock/animals do not need to file a DUNF, only market animals.

What if I need to treat (medicate) my animal after I fill out the form?

As in the past, if you need to treat after submitting the form, you will need to complete a new online DUNF. Use the same link to file a new form.

What if I don't get the DUNF filled out before I get to the fair?

You will not be permitted to weigh in your market animals until the DUNF is completed. The Fair Board will have a list of DUNF's filed as of Noon on July 23<sup>rd</sup>. If you are not on the list, you will not be permitted to weigh.

What device can I use to complete my DUNF?

You can access the link from a computer or any mobile device. For example, you can use your phone to complete the DUNF. Connectivity at the Fairgrounds is sometimes weak, so it is highly recommended that you complete your DUNF **PRIOR** to arrival at the fair and **PRIOR** to the deadline of **NOON** on Friday July 23<sup>rd</sup> so that you are on the completion list.

How will I know if my DUNF is successfully filed?

You will receive an email immediately after filing your DUNF confirming that it is successfully completed.



Please review your July 8 email for full Union County Fair details. Also, be sure to check the bulletin board in the barn AT LEAST once a day for important announcements and updates.

### **Barn Pass Information** (For Livestock Exhibitor families)

Any livestock family wishing to get a barn pass can obtain 1 Barn pass per family, in person, at the Senior Fair Office on the Fairgrounds. Family names will be checked off a list of livestock exhibitors. The Senior Fair Board will be enforcing the one (1) pass per family rule. This Barn pass sticker allows a vehicle to drive toward the barns for unloading feed/equipment **between the hours of 10pm and 9am**. Each livestock family will need to sign for their own barn pass at the Sr. Fair Office; these cannot be picked up by advisors. For questions about this Barn pass privilege, ask the Senior Fair Board.

### **Livestock Arrival Times - All livestock** must enter the State Route 4 fair entrance.

### **Department Specific Announcements:**

#### **Dairy**

- Beef and Dairy Exhibitors may begin bringing equipment into the barn at 9am on Saturday, July 24. Barn chart will be posted at 9am, so do not move in prior.
- It is encouraged that all cattle exhibitors visit the new barn before move-in to determine pen setup, as the barn configuration is different from years past.
- Mulch will be available for purchase for all animals housed in the cattle barn. Mulch fee will be assessed per head @ market price and deducted from the sale check.
- No drilling, nailing, or cutting in cattle barn without approval from the Senior Fair Board.

#### **Beef and Dairy Feeders**

- Beef and Dairy Exhibitors may begin bringing equipment into the barn at 9am on Saturday, July 24. Barn chart will be posted at 9am, so do not move in prior.
- It is encouraged that all cattle exhibitors visit the new barn before move-in to determine pen setup, as the barn configuration is different from years past.

- Mulch will be available for purchase if needed. Mulch fee will be assessed per head @ market price and deducted from the sale check.
- No drilling, nailing, or cutting in cattle barn without approval from the Senior Fair Board.

### **Sheep**

- Reminder: Straw and mulch can NOT be used as bedding in the sheep and goat barn.
- Sheep Showmanship and County Born and Bred show Sunday morning, July 25 at 9 am.
- Sheep Market Show Sunday, July 25 at 5 pm.

### **Swine**

- All market hogs not in the Livestock sale or being sent on packer truck are to be off of the fairgrounds by 9 am Wednesday, July 28.

### **Goat**

- A list of Activities for the Goat Barn exhibitors is included with this email and posted to our website. This flyer lists the key event times for everyone and some optional activities that Goat exhibitors can participate in.
- Reminder: Straw and mulch can NOT be used as bedding in the goat barn.

### **Rabbits**

- Each Rabbit Exhibitor will pay \$5 for shavings upon check-in on Sunday.
- Rabbits and poultry are released starting at **9 pm Thursday and must be out by 9 am Friday.**

### **Poultry**

- All poultry exhibitors will be asked to pay \$2 for shavings at the time of check-in.
- All poultry exhibitors must have current NPIP papers in order to cage their birds at the fair. This is state law. This includes all fancy poultry, pullets, and all market birds (broilers, turkeys and market ducks). Only pigeons, exhibition ducks and exhibition geese are exempt.
- Rabbits and poultry are released starting at 9 pm on Thursday and must be out by 9 am Friday.
