They have purchased some pots and need to clarify who will do the planting. There were issues with watering in the past and Scheiderer may take over the watering contract. Volunteers are advised to check plants frequently the first couple weeks until they are established. Plan to go door-to-door to discuss the program with local merchants. Possible planting dates are May 20 (city pots) and May 23 (merchant pots). Please contact any uptown merchants you know to tell them about the project.

- **Diagnostics/Helpline** <u>Laurie Lowe</u>: hope to start back up in the spring. Need volunteers to come into the office 2-3 hours once per week. Email to follow.
- Love & Learn Chris Burnard: the team will plant 10 gardens to donate produce to the local food pantry, and will hold an education program in June for the public in collaboration w/Project GROW. Roberta's garden an organic layered raised bed over turf is ready. Next meeting will be 6:00 PM before March Business Meeting. Volunteers are needed for this project.
