### **Project Reports:**

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- Adopt-a-Pot Donna Maley & Mary Salimbene Merriman reported two more businesses have signed up to participate. They will begin planting on May 16.
- August Plant Sale Audrey Kise stated set up will take place August 14 and the sale will be held
  August 15. Set seeds and plants aside now. The more plants we offer, the better the turnout will
  be. We will offer shrubs, trees, perennials and bulbs. There are pots in the garage behind the
  Extension office building for MGVs to use. Question was raised about the possibility of getting soil
  from Scotts and whether George has already approached Scotts this year.
- Covered Bridge Festival Bea Metz reported the committee received positive feedback at a recent local tourism meeting. The group has permission to clean up the property and may hold a work day. The group has been asked to decorate the entire area. Send ideas for demo tables to Bea (smetz9@woh.rr.com). Will need 30 volunteers and a 10x10 pop-up tent for the event.
- **Diagnostics/Helpline** Laurie Lowe anticipate gearing up in the May/June timeframe.
- Love & Learn Chris Burnard disclosed the group will start planting May 15, focusing on square foot gardening and companion plants.
- Magnetic Springs Beautification Karen Long John Weiss talked about the area and handed out a
  flyer. Last year the committee planted numerous beds and citizens in the town watered the plants.
  The committee plans to add a bed beside the community hall and the town will provide \$500 for the
  project. Volunteers are needed to help plant on May 30. Showing citizens and a Boy Scout troop
  how to prepare a bed for planting provides an educational component for the project.
- Marketing Kay Covert & Lorna Williamson no updates.
- McCloud Park Dixie Bowen & Julie Jones ask that the bed chairpersons create something to
  demonstrate in each of their beds. For example, how to include edibles, how to use fertilizer and so
  on. On May 11 we will divide perennials. Volunteers are needed. Plants will be used for the August
  Plant Sale and the May 25 Passport to Fishing event at Alders Gate Park (volunteers are needed for
  this event). Plants may also be donated to Habitat for Humanity. A local hardware store will
  provide materials to refinish the bench and a local Boy Scout troop will do the refinishing.

- **Project GROW** Al Burnard stated the committee will receive an SFE Award at IMGC 2015 in Council Bluffs, IA. Al plans to distribute the work schedule to committee members shortly.
